During a recent visit to Sydney I was able to find time to take in the new Australian Motorlife Museum just south of Woollongong that opened late in 2008.

This is a most impressive, purpose built facility where there is a large display of historic motor cars and numerous displays of memorabilia covering the history of motor car servicing, etc. The facility is in the hands of the very capable Wendy Muddell and her team of volunteers who maintain the exhibits, man the entrance, run the shop etc. Additional to the car display there is an extensive library, a very nice meeting room for car clubs with catering facilities, including a bar. There is plenty of parking for large groups with provision for picnics.

It is a completely new building that I saw under construction last year and I estimate the overall size around 25,000 sq. ft., located in the Integral Energy Recreation Park on Darkes Road, Kemplab Grange. From Sydney's Mascot airport to the front gate is 85kms., and the normal GPS recognizes the address. It is great to see the initiative of Wendy and her group and if you are driving to Sydney it is a good place for a coffee break. The local car clubs, including even those in Sydney are really fortunate to have such a first class venue to incorporate in their drive days and travels.

Report 1 from the Formula Junior Springbok Aussie Offensive

The Australian Formula Junior contingent consisting of Peter Boel (Lola), David Reid (Cooper), Roger Ealand (Lotus), Don Thallon (MRC), Kim Shearn (Lotus), Bill Hemming (Elfin), Norm Falkiner (Stanguillini), Neil McCrudden (Lotus) and Lance Cawardine (Macitee), arrived to a very, very, very wet Swartkops circuit just north of Johannesburg. A tricky little circuit which fortunately dried out in time for our Saturday races. The high altitude played havoc with our fuel mixtures and it was very exciting watching 9 people who had no idea what they were doing running around changing jets, ratios and underwear. In the end, from a field of 27 finishers, the aggregate placings were Don Thallon 7th, Roger Ealand 8th, Kim Shearn 11th, Bill Hemming 13th, Niel McCrudden 15th, David Reid 16th, Lance Cawardine 17th, Norm Falkiner 20th, and Peter Boel after a rushed blow up and engine change, 22nd. For some unknown reason, Roger Ealand was awarded a trophy for "Index of Performance"...whatever that means...which we suspect was given to shut him up. It hasn't worked and he has become even more insufferable.

After Swartkops, we went various ways on safaris and wine tours. Apart from Bill and Kim being savaged by supposedly tame half-grown lions and having pants ripped and legs punctured and scratched (I'm sure the bloody animal was trying to bite my nuts off, but they had retreated into my stomach out of abject fear), we all arrived at Cape Town tired but happy, ready for this weekend's meeting at Killarney. By the way, Niel McCrudden won the Formula 2 race at Swartkops in his Marcon against some top class international competition.

Round 2

We all arrived at Cape Town for the Killarney Circuit with cars relatively in 1 piece. The setting of Killarney is in the middle of slums. You have to see South African shanty towns to get the real definition of "slums". It made Calder look like an Oasis. However, the circuit, while a bit rough in places, is a ripper. The Formula Juniors were pulling a timed 135 MPH on the straight.

Over the weekend, Niel McCrudden heavily damaged his F2 Marcon after leading his race. Martin Bullock came 2nd in his Chevron F2. In the Formula Junior runs, Don Thallon's MRC destroyed (totally) his engine, Peter Boel's Lola ran out of bits to keep his motor running and Lance Cawardine's Macitee simply failed to proceed.

The finishing order in the race was Kim Shearn (Lotus 18) 8th, Roger Ealand (Lotus 18) 9th after a fantastic race long battle with Kim, Bill Hemming (Elfin) 10th, David Reid (Cooper) 15th after hurried front end repairs from an earlier coming together, Neil McCrudden (Lotus 20) 16th and Norm Falkiner (Stanguellini) 19th. Bill's finish gave him and his Elfin an eventual 3rd outright in the Formula Junior World Series as this was the final race. A major proof of consistency winning over skill!

On the road trip from Cape Town to East London for the last meeting, we all took in the picturesque Garden Route and stopped off in Animal Parks to cuddle tigers, cheetahs and snakes.

East London Grand Prix circuit looks ridiculously fast and the circuit is virtually derelict. Hired help is currently cutting weeds and grass off the kerbs this morning, 1 hour before practice begins. It looks like we're in for a scary weekend.

The final round of the Formula Junior 50th Anniversary has been run at East London Grand Prix Circuit. And what a circuit. It was unanimously voted the best circuit ever by all drivers.

Unfortunately it is a decrepit state (the facilities, not the track surface which is actually a public road) and is under threat by property developers. Turn 1 (Potters corner) is not to be taken lightly. About one in ten of the cars held it flat and the circuit gives out stickers "I'VE GOT THE BALLS FOR POTTERS" with very unsubtle graphics. The visit by international drivers and cars was an important part in the promoters attempts to save the circuit.

After 2 close and exciting races, the results were Roger Ealand (Lotus 18) 6th, Bill Hemming (Elfin) 9th, Kim Shearn (Lotus 18) 10th, Don Thallon (MRC) 13th, David Reid (Cooper) 15th, Neil McCrudden (Lotus 20) 16th, Norm Falkiner (Stanguillini) 19th, Lance Cawardine (Macitee) 20th.

It must be noted that Don had his broken engine and main shaft hurriedly repaired for a run, Neil generously lent his car to Peter Boel for one race, and Norm (spin) and Lance (gearbox) failed to finish.

Following the meeting, the cars were cleaned and packed into the containers for the long trip home. To give you some idea of the state of squalor and crime in South Africa, the race organisers kindly connected 4 hoses to the back of the pit area for us to clean the cars. Within half an hour, the hoses and taps were pinched. Having said that, the Aussie party didn't go out of it's way to look for trouble, and while we witnessed some nasty behaviour, we didn't experience any real danger. Generally, if we made the first move at being friendly, the people were terrific. But again, the overseas experience has proved just how well organised and hospitable our race meetings are at home.

At the prize giving on the final night, the Australian team was extremely loud in voice and clothing (our bright yellow team shirts again proved to be a popular standout). Roger Ealand and David Reid in particular were just a little bit embarrassing and the rest of us had to apologise for their inappropriate behaviour. David was forgiven because he did a magnificent job of organising freight etc. I'm afraid Roger, as the winning Australian, should not be allowed to represent our country again. Now he no longer organises Speed on Tweed, best we simply send him back to the country from whence he came.

After a year of sensational events, I've got to say that this Formula Junior category has provided the best racing experience I've ever had. Great cars, full grids, great people and great racing. We can only hope the momentum can be maintained as a stand alone category.
